ICEBERG is a European Union Project that aims to bring to light critical situations of abuse where women, victims of domestic violence, are subject and which remain hidden. The ICEBERG project, aims to protect and fully recover them in society and to enhance their personal independence (empowerment). To achieve this, the project builds a “Community Embrace” through the creation of local coalitions (public-private partnership) so that women can feel supported and protected by the citizens.

At the same time, the awareness of the citizens will give grater confidence to women who are victims of gender violence.
